### Welcome

Welcome to Hucknall Flying High Academy's first termly SEND newsletter. We have had a brilliant start to the school year, and we are really looking forward to the upcoming academic year. I am Mrs Hitchen the school's newly appointed SENCO I have worked at Hucknall Flying High Academy in Key Stage One since the school opened in September 2019.

### SENCo's role

As a SENCo my role is to make sure that our school SEND policy is implemented daily and that there is the correct provision and support in place for the children within our school.

Throughout the school year you are more than likely to communicate with your child's class teacher. However, class teachers are in regular communication with me. Any concerns are raised directly and discussed to ensure they are fully understood. Parent/carers comments or concerns relating to SEND are passed on. The SENCO, with parent/carers consent, is able to seek advice from external agencies, if this is appropriate.

As SENCO I will visit each class every half term, and more often if needed, to observe or offer support. In addition to this some of my duties include supporting with assessments, completing referrals, sending enquiries to outside agencies, submitting EHC requests, completing SEN reviews, monitoring data and arranging training for staff.

If you have any concerns about your child or feel they may have any additional needs, please contact your child's class teacher in the first instance.

At the end of this newsletter you will find a series of services that you can readily access for free.

### Drop in Coffee Mornings

Every half term I will be hosting a SEND drop in coffee morning in the school hall. Everyone is welcome to attend, (but please could you book in via the office, so we are aware of numbers) this is an opportunity to ask any questions. Our first coffee morning will take place on **Friday 13th October** between **9 & 10AM**.

### Snack & Chat

Every week on a Wednesday I will be hosting a drop-in session in the Year 1 classroom. This is open to all children to come in and discuss how they are finding their learning and if they need any support. Children's voice is paramount to SEND provision after all they know themselves better than anybody!

Our first snack and chat will take place on

**Wednesday 20th September.**

### Homework Club

As requested by many parents during the Summer SEND reviews. I will be running a homework club in the Year 1 classroom every Thursday lunchtime. KS2 (12 children) homework club will run from 12:00-12:30 and KS1 (8 children) will run from 12:30-1:00PM. Children have been selected for this half term by conversations with parents or with class teachers. If you would like your child to be considered for Autumn 2 please let your child's class teacher know.

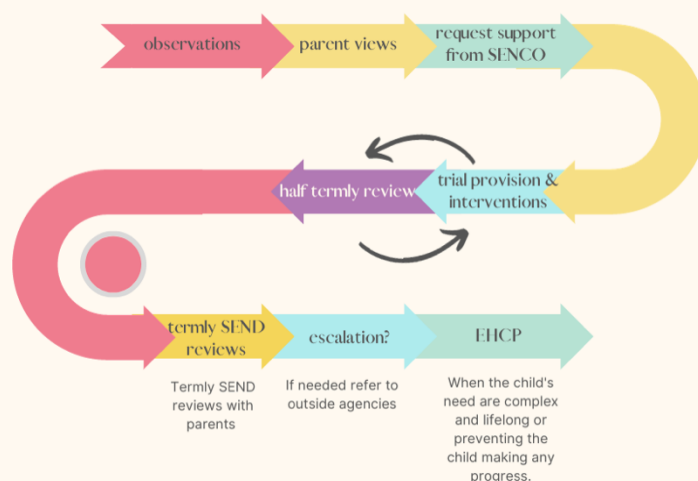
### Review Meetings

Review meetings are held for children on the SEND register (SEND support), three times a year (November, March and June). During the first week of October, we will be holding an additional SEND review meeting for those children that we feel need discussing sooner. I will be in contact with those parents shortly with a date and time. All SEND review meetings will be held with myself and child's class teacher and are an opportunity to discuss progress and update their Provision Map. Any child included on our SEND concern list will be discussed at parent/carers' consultation evening. However, please get in touch with your child's class teacher if you have any concerns outside of these times in the first instance. I have an appointment system which is available to book via the office, preferably by email. These will be available most weeks at 3pm on Thursday and 9am on Friday.

## SEND at Hucknall Flying High Academy

The SEND section of our school website will be undergoing a refresh during the coming weeks. Please keep your eye out for any changes. As part of the SEND Code of Practice, we follow the graduated approach (please see attached). This means we step up support in a gradual process to ensure we are providing the correct support needed. Nottinghamshire Local Authority requires evidence of this to provide any further support such as additional funding or visits from external professionals.

## Emotional Literacy Support Assistant ELSA

### What is an ELSA?

ELSAs are emotional literacy support assistants. They are support staff who have had special training from educational psychologists to support the emotional development of children and young people in school. ELSAs have regular professional supervision from educational psychologists to help them in their work.

### How does my child access support from an ELSA?

Requests for ELSA support come through the SENCO after discussions with class teachers, parents and ELSAs.

### What is the role of an ELSA?

To provide support for children's social, emotional and behavioural needs and therefore support mental health and well-being. This is achieved by giving them skills to understand and regulate their emotions, giving confidence in themselves and improving self esteem.

ELSAs also help support bereavement, young carers and any overwhelming situations children may have or be experiencing

### What happens in an ELSA session?

Normally, ELSAs deliver six 20 minute sessions, which start with getting to know the child to build the relationship. The sessions are tailored to the individual's needs and are very different for each child. The sessions might focus on calming strategies, recognising and regulating emotions or may just be time to talk about something that is worrying them. It is not counselling or therapy.
